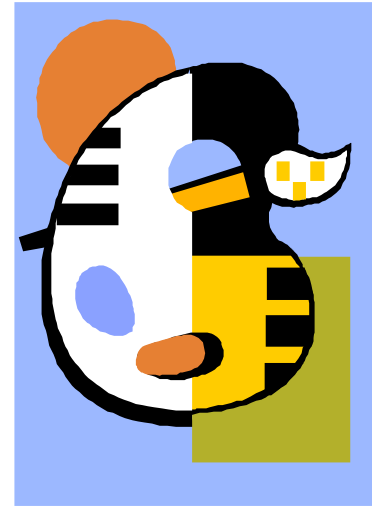
Art Club
